FOR said Sales and Use Tax. <p style="text-align: center;">NON-PARTISAN</p> <p><u>City of Falls City Proposal to Increase Local Sales and Use Tax Rate</u></p> <p>Shall the City Council of Falls City, Nebraska, increase the local sales and use tax rate by one-half percent (0.5 %) upon the same transactions within the City of Falls City on which the State of Nebraska is authorized to impose a tax, with all revenues generated by the additional one-half percent (0.5 %) to be used for public infrastructure projects under the following terms and conditions?</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> (1) Revenues generated by the additional one-half percent (0.5 %) shall be used to pay the costs to construct, acquire, improve, furnish and equip public infrastructure improvements of the City, which shall include utility infrastructure upgrades for water, sewer, gas and electric systems serving the City of Falls City, Nebraska and for development of 33rd Street in the City. (2) Expiration of Tax Rate Change. The increased sales and use tax rate will be implemented and related revenues collected beginning as soon as practicable after voter approval and continuing for a period of ten (10) years, unless bonds are issued with some or all of the additional revenues pledged for payment of such bonds, in which case the increased sales and use tax rate will remain in effect and additional revenues will be collected until payment in full of such bonds and any refunding bonds. (3) Interlocal Cooperation Agreement. The City of Falls City and the Community Redevelopment Authority of the City of Falls City have entered into an Interlocal Agreement for the long term development of unified governance of public infrastructure projects in the City. Additional revenue collected from the additional one-half percent (0.5%) sales and use tax will not be used for the purposes of such Interlocal Agreement, but will be used for the public infrastructure projects of the City of Falls City as described above. <p>VOTE FOR or AGAINST</p> <p>I vote FOR authorizing an increase of one-half percent (.5%) in the City of Falls City’s local sales and use tax under such terms and conditions</p> <p>I vote AGAINST authorizing an increase of one-half percent (.5%) in the City of Falls City’s local sales and use tax under such terms and conditions</p> <p><i>If a majority of the votes cast upon such question shall be in favor of such tax, then the governing body of the City of Falls City shall be empowered as provided by Section 77-27,142 and shall forthwith proceed to impose a tax pursuant to the Local Option Revenue Act. If a majority of those voting on the question shall be opposed to such tax, then the governing body of the City of Falls City shall not impose such a tax.</i></p>			

In compliance with Section 32-811(1)(a); if the names of candidates properly filed for nomination at the primary election for directors of natural resources districts, directors of public power districts, members of airport authority boards elected pursuant to sections 32-547 to 32-549, members of the boards of governors of community college areas, members of the boards of Class III or Class V school districts which nominate candidates at a primary election, and officers of cities of the first or second class and cities having a city manager plan of government do not exceed two candidates for each position to be filled, any such candidates shall be declared nominated and their names shall not appear on any primary election ballots; (b) If the number of candidates properly filed for the nomination of a political party at the primary election for any county officer elected pursuant to sections 32-517 to 32-529 does not exceed the number of candidates to be nominated by that party for that office, any such properly filed candidates shall be declared nominated and their names shall not appear on any primary election ballots. Therefore, those candidates filing for the following offices are hereby nominated and their names will appear on the General Election ballot:
